We'd like to introduce Robert Heitkamp

22 years ago, **Robert** discovered his passion for diving and underwater photography. Over time, both the equipment and the fish he photographed increased in size. He works at the publishing house for "Märkische Oderzeitung" in Frankfurt (Oder) as Head of Controlling.



Robert's photos have already attracted attention in the diving magazine "unterwasser" and one of his shark photos got selected for the accompanying calendar. Robert's first close encounter with sharks happened in the Maldives where he dived with blacktip reef sharks. He saw cat sharks in the Mediterranean Sea and later made the acquaintance of oceanic white tip sharks in the Red Sea. Fascinated by the sharks and the personal interactions, he decided to go on a tour to Guadalupe to dive with White Sharks in 2012, where he also met **Erich** and **Andy Dellios** for the first time.

Summer at the beach – and maybe sharks???

How to behave correctly when encountering a shark?

SharkSchool® and SharkSchool® Teaching provide information:

Like every year, millions of people will travel to the sea this summer. What they all share is their love of swimming in the sea, but often also a vague fear of sharks and thus the question that has been asked over and over: How should a swimmer or snorkeler behave when a shark appears?



Always remain in a vertical position!



The number one rule is that you should stop any active movement, assume a vertical position, and keep your legs as immobilized as possible. In case you can still stand on the ground, do so quietly and not move any further, except for slowly pivoting and to keep eye contact with the shark. Always focus on the shark until you lose sight of it. If the shark seems to have disappeared, remain in the same spot for 1 minute (as a swimmer, keep moving your arms) and keep pivoting.

Help spread the word. Because every negative headline in the media about a shark accident is one too many.

Again, briefly summarized: Assume a vertical position, keep your legs still, turn with the shark and keep an eye on it. If necessary, push it away or push water towards the gills. Also known as: Face-Guide-Push-Move. SharkSchool® and SharkSchool® Teaching
